- c. or four courses from one prefix: AAS (http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/aa_s/) or AFRS (http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/afrs/) or LTNS (http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/ltns/) or RRS (http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/rrs/);
- d. partial completion of a minor or certificate;
- e. units earned in a study abroad program;
- f. or a coherent group of courses complementary to the major.

With the approval of an advisor in the major, courses which fulfill the Complementary Studies requirement may be lower- or upper-division units, resident, or transfer units.
