⁵ **Complementary Studies**

Students completing a Bachelor of Arts in American Indian Studies must complete 12units in Complementary Studies in courses bearing a prefix other than AIS or courses cross-listed with AIS. These units may be in:

- a language other than English;
- one course from AAS (http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/aa_s/), AFRS (<http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/afrs/>), LTNS (<http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/ltns/>), and RRS (<http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/rrs/>);
- or four courses from one prefix: AAS (http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/aa_s/) or AFRS (<http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/afrs/>) or LTNS (<http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/ltns/>) or RRS (<http://bulletin.sfsu.edu/courses/rrs/>);
- partial completion of a minor or certificate;
- units earned in a study abroad program;
- or a coherent group of courses complementary to the major.

With the approval of an advisor in the major, courses which fulfill the Complementary Studies requirement may be lower- or upper-division units, resident, or transfer units.
