MINOR IN THEATRE ARTS

Program Learning Outcomes

- 1. Students will develop competence at thinking conceptually and critically about text, performance and production.
- 2. Students will demonstrate foundational knowledge of the historical and cultural dimensions of theater, including the works of leading playwrights, actors, directors, and designers both past and present.
- 3. Students will demonstrate foundational knowledge of a wide selection of theatre repertory including principal era, genres and cultural sources.
- 4. Students will demonstrate the ability to develop and defend informed judgments about theatre.

A minimum of 6 upper-division units are required to complete the minor.

All coursework used to satisfy the requirements of the minor must be completed with a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
